About the Project

The project aimed at strengthening cross-border cooperation between Latvia and Belarus to counter irregular border crossings and the risks associated with irregular transit migration during large-scale cross-border public events. Its main components were capacity building on border management as well as risk analysis and facilitation of communication through an expanded network of common contact points.

Due to the changing geopolitical context, this project saw an early termination in September 2021 and not all activities could be fully completed. For more info on implemented activities, see below.

Activities



Capacity Building on Border Management

This component included activities aimed at learning about good practices from Ukraine and Slovakia in hosting and managing large-scale public events, as well as a series of bilateral meetings and trainings aimed at strengthening LV-BY mutual understanding and joint operational capacity. The guidelines for joint investigation of border incidents were updated and used for practical exercises. Moreover, border surveillance and investigation equipment was purchased and delivered to Belarus.



Capacity Building on Risk Analysis

Experts from the region developed SOPs for risk analysis in order to build a joint framework for central and regional-level risk analysts at the Belarus and Latvian border. Additionally, Customs authorities from Latvia and Belarus took proactive part in the activities by bringing valuable information on modus operandi identified at the border.

Joint Operations and Exercises

National experts met to discuss and agree on a contingency plan incorporating FRONTEX recommendations. A practical exercise was then organised on the prevention of specific unauthorized activities at border crossing points. A wide range of actors was involved in the exercise, including "green border" surveillance units, training institutions, customs, and police.



Common Contact Points and Focal Points

A Joint Protocol was drafted and agreed at operational level between the parties. Moreover, equipment for document examination was purchased and delivered to Belarus.
