

LEGAL MIGRATION AND MOBILITY

Pilot project for business mobility between Belgium and Senegal (PEM WECCO)

Project completed

About the Project

The PEM WECCO mobility scheme enabled knowledge and practical exchange between Belgian and Senegalese companies. Aiming to build the capacities of Senegalese entrepreneurs and connect them with their Belgian counterparts, the project offered short-term mobility opportunities for business purposes while contributing to the development of a sustainable economic partnership between the two countries. Furthermore, by promoting a safe environment for institutional dialogue around professional mobility between Senegal and Belgium, the project sought to strengthen trust between public and private actors in order to establish entrepreneurial mobility as a secure channel for temporary migration.



Enabel, the Belgian Development Agency, implemented the project in collaboration with the Belgian Immigration Office (Office des Étrangers).





Activities



Pre-departure

Forty-seven (47) Senegalese entrepreneurs were selected to participate in the project. Prior to their departure for Belgium, they received support and training, including on the Belgian entrepreneurial ecosystem to help them make the most of their stay in Belgium. A mapping of relevant institutional and private sector actors was conducted to facilitate the formation of institutional partnerships and to inform the capacity-building interventions.



Mobility

Upon arrival in Belgium, Senegalese professionals engaged in learning and exchange itineraries with Belgian companies and business incubators, with the aim of creating cross-country partnerships between economic and business support actors. These partnerships were intended to support the creation, incubation, acceleration, and internationalisation of businesses in Senegal.

Post-mobility support

Upon their return to Senegal, entrepreneurs had access to post-mobility services designed to facilitate the realization of their partnerships. At the end of the project, more than 29 partnership agreements have been signed between Senegalese and Belgian Small and Medium-Size Entreprises. These include commercial agreements, joint ventures, and the creation of new products/services. Services were tailored to the different types of partnerships forged during the mobility phase.



Cross-cutting activities

Throughout the project, networks were strengthened - not only between companies but also among public and private actors involved in private sector development and mobility in the two countries. A variety of workshops and seminars, as well as the exchange of learning notes, helped to gather and disseminate best practices that emerged from the project.
